Provides the highest quality care for students, including assessments, treatment recommendations, services and referrals. Documents and monitors progress of individual cases.
- Consults with senior clinicians on complex cases or on problems outside their area of expertise.
- Serves as a resource for other professional staff and training staff. May supervise training staff.
- Presents psycho-educational workshops for students and academic departments.
- Provides outreach consultation to faculty and staff regarding student concerns.
