Institute, with an emphasis on community-engagement, strategic communication and narrative, and leadership development, partnership building, and training with artists and community-based organizations. The Arts and Cultural strategist will implement work that helps expand our audiences, increase the visibility of the Institute's identity and name, and helps in the dissemination of our messages, frames, concepts, and research.
