The Hurley laboratory is interested in fundamental questions of how the interactions between proteins and membranes determine cell and organelle shape and the evolution of shape over time, how protein-membrane interactions turn on and off the signals that control essential cell processes, and how pathogens such as HIV-1 subvert and co-opt these interactions.

The lab philosophy is to use a battery of powerful approaches to uncover molecular mechanism. This might mean cryoelectron microscopy, x-ray crystallography, single molecule spectroscopy, mass spectrometry, biochemical reconstitution, or live-cell imaging. We do it all.
