Position Description

We are looking for a Research Assistant (RA) to join our team. The RA will work in person with our faculty, staff and students on several ongoing projects. Projects range from implementing and evaluating a videogame-supported afterschool program for very young, at-risk adolescents-to testing a hospital staff training program that is designed to prevent violence among adult psychiatric inpatients at Napa State Hospital. The RA will be an integral member of our diverse team of researchers and community partners-assisting with data collection, interacting with our team, and helping drive innovative solutions to complex problems.

Responsibilities

- Help implement a highly structured group intervention at multiple Bay Area middle schools, which includes directly supporting the lead facilitator by supervising gaming, troubleshooting technical issues, helping organize tournaments, managing prizes and other related tasks as they arise.
- Participant recruitment, tracking and retention.
- Participant interviewing/surveying (direct data collection at research sites).
- Help coordinate hospital staff training sessions.
- Attend team meetings, correspond with the study team, and process data.
- Other duties as required

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Required Qualifications

- Strong interpersonal skills, including the ability to work well with community partners, stakeholders, academics, and students.
- Strong organizational skills as demonstrated by the ability to effectively manage multiple tasks.
- Strong verbal and written communication skills, including the ability to summarize and present complex information in a clear and concise manner.
- Strong working knowledge of MS office--particularly Excel, Word and PowerPoint.
- Willingness to work cooperatively in a team environment.
- Familiarity with video games and ability to troubleshoot technical issues.
- Ability to take initiative and manage workload under supervision.
- Cultural responsiveness: ability to work with a diverse population.
- Availability during business hours; with flexibility to work on evenings or weekends as needed based on project requirements.
- Reliable transportation to get to research sites. Punctuality is required.
- Graduation from high school or General Education Diploma and two years of experience in collection of survey data or equivalent combination of education and experience.

Preferred Qualifications

- Clinical and/or research interviewing experience.
- Experience, training, or background working in school or afterschool settings.
- Experience, training, or background working in mental health and/or education fields.
- Experience working with R or SPSS statistical software/databases.
- Fluency in Spanish (strongly preferred)
- Experience working with children and adolescents (strongly preferred)
