With over 500 dedicated staff members serving over 10M building square feet and 1100 acres, Facilities Services includes the asset management program, custodial services, maintenance operations, engineering and technical services, environmental services, grounds operations, the Cal Zero Waste program.

As a key strategist, this role works closely with the Associate Vice Chancellor to develop and implement both long- and short-term plans for UC Berkeley's sustainability efforts, driving initiatives with campus-wide impact. The position requires advanced professional knowledge to resolve complex environmental challenges while navigating a highly visible, politically sensitive, and legally complex landscape. Responsibilities include managing professional staff, vendors, and consultants involved in various administrative and project functions. The role leverages a deep understanding of UC protocols and sustainability expertise to research, develop, and implement sustainability efforts across the



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campus. As a recognized expert, the individual provides guidance to campus leadership, staff, faculty, and students, as well as UC locations and community partners, on topics such as climate action, sustainable physical planning, green buildings, renewable energy, water and energy efficiency, sustainable procurement, and waste reduction. The role also serves as an internal consultant, integrating sustainability into campus strategic and physical planning while researching and implementing new practices for the campus and the UC system. Additionally, the position involves project development and management, establishing performance metrics, enhancing sustainability-focused curriculum and research, and leading communication and outreach efforts to foster behavioral and organizational change. The individual manages data collection and reporting, while working to establish UC Berkeley as a leader in sustainability at local, national, and international levels. As the sustainability spokesperson, this role represents the University on internal and external boards, at conferences, in media interactions, and through engagement with visitors from around the world.

- Works with faculty, students, and administrative partners to educate, foster a culture of, and operationalize sustainability on campus.
- Pursues opportunities for grants, partnerships, philanthropy, and other resources to support sustainability efforts.
- Works closely with campus partners including Facilities, EH&S, and Capital Strategies to develop and implement projects and programs that deliver sustainability initiatives in clean energy, green building, climate action, zero waste, water consumption, and other areas.
- Oversees student interns working on sustainability initiatives in cooperation with academic units.
- Develops and creates effective communication to share sustainability goals, initiatives, and strategies.
- Oversees the content of websites and social media in support of sustainability communication.
- Works with campus partners on internal and external communication regarding sustainability and acts as campus spokesperson when necessary.
- Facilitates communication strategies to provide awareness of sustainability, energy management, and resource conservation programs.



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- Collaborates with University administration to shape and deliver campus messages about sustainability to internal and external constituencies and serves as campus spokesperson as necessary.
- Coordinates outreach and education programs related to UC Berkeley's sustainability efforts.
- Gathers, analyzes, and monitors campus data on energy consumption, program metrics, sustainability cost drivers, and other inputs to inform sustainability efforts.
- Oversees the data gathering, monitoring, and reporting responsibilities for internal, external, and rating organization partners.
- Provides a framework for policy and administrative change, developing strategies for change management to remove barriers to goal achievement.
- Acts as technical lead for campus sustainability measures and best practices.
- Provides strategic oversight for the development of the annual budget, determining expense
 priorities, and recommending and implementing changes to methods, unit planning, staffing,
 programs, and other financial activities.
- Initiates and designs campus studies, summary reports, and background materials, including approaches, trends, and sources and uses, that have a significant impact on individual or multiple departments.
