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Departmental Overview

The Berkeley Risk & Security Lab (BRSL) at the UC Berkeley's Goldman School of Public Policy is an academic research center focused on the intersection of technology and security. The Lab conducts analytical research, designs and fields wargames, and engages with policy-makers and stakeholders in government, private industry, and civil society. A common theme throughout our research is examining how new technologies and capabilities-from dual-use technologies to those designed for military applications-might impact strategic stability and the prospects for international peace and security.

The Berkeley Risk and Security Lab is seeking a research scholar to focus on the lab's growing artificial intelligence portfolio. In particular, the research scholar will be expected to work with researchers at BRSL and other Al-focused entities on campus on matters of Al risk, governance, safety, and redteaming, as well as collaborate with technical teams assessing the capabilities and vulnerabilities of Al systems. The research scholar will play a critical and active role in shaping a research agenda in this domain, and will be responsible for laying the foundations for an on-going program of investigation.

The role is well suited for candidates with a technical background who are interested in making connections between technical AI developments and their implications on policy, politics, and society. The scholar will have opportunities to propose and implement research projects that align with the Laboratory's programming.

The research scholar will work closely with BRSL's Faculty and Lab Directors, affiliated Berkeley faculty, and external collaborators to conduct scholarly research and contribute to ongoing policy debates. The scholar will be expected to produce novel research results communicated in academic publications, lead research workshops or other convening on the topic of their research, and participate in the relevant academic conferences and policy conversations.
