Responsibilities

- Applies advanced concepts to conduct wide-ranging needs analysis for health care programs.

 workshop series, and other outreach efforts. Makes recommendations on health promotion and
 education programs to help meet the complex and varied needs of the campus. Create reports to
 support funding and continuous improvement of student outreach programming.
- Assesses the effectiveness of the promotion and education of entire student mental healthcare programs, and makes recommendations that may have broad impact to the programs. Offers advising to staff supporting student wellness programming
- Serve as student mental health liaison to academic departments and registered student organizations who want to focus more on student wellness, particularly prevention efforts.
- Attend regular meetings with other student mental health peer coordinators and preventionfocused health educators within UHS.
- Attend campus and departmental committees aimed at supporting student flourishing and wellness.
