- Is comfortable engaging with the public both in one-on-one and group settings. Works with supervisor to develop communication and outreach strategies.
- Serves as a liaison between departmental programs (Summer Sessions, Pre-College Programs, and UC Extended Education), prospective students, and the broader UC Campus.
- Maintains an updated database of prospective students to determine their needs, manages and tracks them through the pipeline.
- Maintains a working knowledge of Summer Sessions, Pre-College Programs, and UC Extended Education offerings, consulting with staff and cross-functional colleagues as needed.
- Under direction and guidance, implements aspects of events to enhance recruitment and yield.



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- Evaluates services to determine impact of recruitment activities with development of new and refined strategies for maximizing outreach.
- Uses professional knowledge and sound judgement to relate to prospective students to establish professional rapport and add to the student experience.
