To stimulate discovery at the intersection of the physical and biological sciences, QB3-C promotes multidisciplinary research at world-class facilities including the Bakar Bio Labs and Bakar Labs for Energy and Materials incubators at UC Berkeley, creates innovative educational programs, and fosters industry partnerships in the areas of health, energy, and the environment.

Responsibilities

Overview:

The Bakar Bio Labs Director of Partnerships manages the Bakar Labs Industry Affiliate Program and Tenant Enrichment Programming. The Bakar Bio Labs Industry Affiliate Program generates \$1M in annual funding for Bakar Bio Labs and creates enrichment programming for life science startups. At the direction of the Chief Operating Officer and the Bakar Labs Director and in collaboration with the Bakar Bio Labs Managing Director, the incumbent facilitates partnership development, maintains partner relationships, and tracks partner renewals and the Bakar Bio Labs facilities at UC Berkeley and



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will be responsible for developing an Affiliate Program for the new UCSF incubator opening in late 2028.

The Director manages all programs relevant to the Affiliate Program, including but not limited to advisory group meetings, partner office hours, the Bakar Bio Labs speaker series, partner communications (i.e., quarterly newsletters), and other partner events. Additionally, the Director manages and executes "Golden Ticket" programs for the Bakar Bio Labs, including sponsor recruitment, developing program timelines, managing the application process, and leading communications with the sponsor. The Director works in collaboration with the

Bakar Bio Labs Managing Director to manage the tenant selection process. The incumbent helps track and build potential tenant relationships with the goal of recruiting new startups to the incubator and plans monthly selection and recruitment committee meetings for Bakar Bio Labs. The Director reports to the Chief Operating Officer of Bakar Labs.

Partner Recruitment & Renewal Management:

- Manage outreach to and development of new external relationships and programs with industry partners.
- Manage recruitment of new industry partners in collaboration with Executive Director, COO, Managing Director and Lab Operations Manager.
- Work with VCRO and finance team to oversee renewal process for existing partners, ensuring agreements are renewed in a timely matter.

Bakar Bio Labs Tenant Recruitment & Selection:

- Work in collaboration with Bakar Bio Labs Managing Director to manage the Bakar Bio Labs tenant selection process with the goal of recruiting new startups to the incubator.
- Manage system to track the Bakar Bio Labs application process.

Current Partnership Management:

- Track all partner relationships.
- Develop and manage programs of interest and relevant to external partners.
- Manage programs to keep all partners regularly engaged. These programs may include, but are not limited to, advisory group meetings, partner office hours, the Bakar Bio Labs Speaker Series, partner communications, etc.
- Work with communications team to create and distribute quarterly newsletters for partners,



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providing updates on the incubator operations, tenants, and events.

Tenant Enrichment Program:

- Manage and develop tenant enrichment programs.
- Direct other events relevant to tenant enrichment and the affiliate program (i.e. Pitch Days, Investor Events, etc.)
- Develop content to promote the Speaker Series.
- Track and manage scheduling, expenses, event planning and speaker content.
- Track all building enrichment programming and report to Executive Director, COO and Board as appropriate.

Affiliate Program Strategy:

- At the direction of the COO, manage affiliate program strategy and planning. Includes affiliate tiers, cost, and allocated resources.
- Create an overarching industry affiliate strategy for the new biotech incubator at Mission Bay (opening in late 2028), including developing a communication strategy to begin reaching out to potential industry partners, leading to formal discussions with partners in 2027.

Golden Ticket Program Management:

- Recruit and direct Golden Ticket Programs for Bakar Labs.
- Manage sponsor recruitment.
- Develop program timelines.
- Work with Director of Communications to develop a communications strategy for the program.
- Manage relationship with Golden Ticket sponsor.
- Plans and executes finalist selection process and pitch day. Includes: managing finalist selection, overseeing pitch day scheduling, managing pitch day schedule and reception, working with the sponsor to ensure their goals are met.

Advisory Group Meetings:

 Coordinate Advisory Group meetings to bring together partners, scientific advisory board and selection committee.
