Position Summary

The Masters-Level Clinician in our integrated care team provides brief, targeted evidence-based behavioral assessment and clinical services within a collaborate, interdisciplinary healthcare setting. This position bridges mental health and physical health care, offering screening, assessment, consultation, brief intervention, and coordination of care across the lifespan in an integrated, outpatient setting.

Key Responsibilities:

- Conduct initial behavioral assessments using brief assessments and develop patientcentered, evidence-based treatment plans.
- Utilize motivational interviewing to assess patients readiness for change, identify barriers to care and compliance, and help address barriers to patient self-management of mental and physical health conditions.
- Provide brief, targeted evidence-based interventions to address common medical and mental health conditions.
- Work with patients to identify actionable treatment goals and empower patients to selfmanage their health. Screen for mental health conditions including depression, anxiety, substance use disorders, pain, trauma, and medication adherence.
- Complete risk assessments of patients in crisis or with suicidal thoughts using evidencebased tools.
- Act as a valued consultant and resource to members of the care team on skillful and effective interventions with patients with chronic illness and mental health diagnoses.
 Document patient encounters in the electronic health record system.
- Actively participate in professional development activities and collaborate with the primary care team to develop guidelines and education for patients to improve self-management of chronic health concerns.
- Conduct group therapy sessions as appropriate.
- Participate in team meetings and interdisciplinary case conferences.
