Position Summary

This position raises leadership gifts from parents of current students and parents of alumni to support the Cal Parents Fund (Cal Fund) and other needs across the UC Berkeley campus. The position also works with the rest of the Cal Parents and Family Philanthropy team in UDAR to support and advance family philanthropy across campus, making families an increasingly significant source of financial support for schools, colleges and other units at Cal. Specifically, this position proactively manages a portfolio of 200-250 individual leadership and major gift prospects who have the capacity to give between \$100,000 and \$250,000 over five years, making an average of 10 in-person and on-screen visits per month plus substantive contacts to advance the donor relationship. This position qualifies major gift prospects and solicits gifts directly; ensures that predetermined fundraising goals are met; and partners with a Prospect Management liaison. This position also partners with the other members of the Parent and Family Philanthropy team to manage donor cultivation activities.

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Responsibilities

- Independently manages a portfolio of 200-250 current and prospective donors who are parents or other family of current or alumni students.
- Skillfully moves donors through qualification, cultivation, solicitation, stewardship and resolicitation, raising at least \$500,000 annually for the university.
- Provides analysis and information of complex results or activities, and makes recommendations to upper management for program changes or development of new programs as required.
- Participates in the planning, execution and evaluation of donor events and uses such events to establish and build relationships with current and potential donors.
- Develops strategies within existing policy guidelines.
- Participates in short- and long-range strategic planning of fund development and donor relations programs.
- May coordinate and oversee the work of support staff, volunteers and/or other professionals.

- Thorough working knowledge of fundraising, donor relations, and public relations concepts, principles, procedures, and techniques.

- Strong organizational, analytical and critical thinking skills, including skills in creative and

- Strong skills in maintaining confidentiality.
- Bachelor's degree in related area and/or equivalent experience/training.
