Position Summary

The Brook lab seeks a Staff Research Associate (SRA) to aid in the acquisition and analysis of HIV genomic data from population studies at our field site in Madagascar. The position will involve traveling to Madagascar and performing RNA extraction, qPCR, and amplicon sequencing of HIV from samples collected from clinical surveillance, in addition to extensive phylogenetic analysis of these samples using programs such as BEAST, RAxML, and/or iQTree. In addition, the position will be responsible for analyzing HV serological data amassed from Luminex-based serology of serum eluted from dry blood spots collected in southeastern Madagascar. All tasks will be performed under close supervision and instruction from the PI.

Responsibilities

• RNA extraction, qPCR, and amplicon sequencing of samples collected from people living with



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HIV (PLHIV) in a Madagascar molecular lab.

- Assembly of HIV genomes from sequencing data and submission to GenBank and the Los Alamos sequence database.
- Computational analysis of resulting HIV sequences in BEAST, iQtree and RAxML, including
 ancestral state reconstruction of localities of most recent common ancestor for specific
 monophyletic clades and quantification of the rate of HIV transmission from HIV sequence
 clusters identified through time.
- Field support on a new public health study to collect new samples from PLHIV in northern Madagascar.
- Analysis of pre-existing Luminex serological data reporting some HIV+ samples, collected from a cross-sectional general population sample in southeastern Madagascar.

Required Qualifications

- Laboratory experience in RNA extraction, qPCR, and genomic sequencing.
- Experience assembling genomes from raw NGS data.
- Experience with phylodynamic analysis in BEAST, RAxML, IQtree, or similar software.
- Proficiency in French language.
- Prior field experience in Madagascar.
- Bachelor's degree in related area and/or equivalent experience/training.

Preferred Qualifications

- Coursework in public health, epidemiology, or equivalent.
- Prior experience implementing public health studies in the field.
- Prior experience in analysis serological data.
- Some knowledge of Malagasy language.
