This involves developing, promoting, and supporting the operational and strategic aspects of intercollegiate student-athlete programs, including planning with the coaching staff to develop competition and practice schedules, coordinating team travel, planning for and managing annual budgets, purchasing needed items, etc. Additionally, this position works autonomously to monitor department, campus, conference, and NCAA deadlines, track team expenses, plan special events, etc., and reports this information back to the coaching staff.

This position is also involved in a variety of other department projects, which include but are not limited to: Competition Schedule collection and game guarantee development; Rugby recruiting events; and Post-Season Championships.
