Established in 1943, BPH is a professional school on the UC Berkeley campus that comprises six academic divisions and nearly 30 research centers and programs. Our department's values include social justice, health as a right, challenging conventional thought, embracing diversity, and creating meaningful impact. We honor our principles of community by centering and valuing everyone in our community; prioritizing prevention while remaining grounded in social justice; promoting safety and respect; practicing self-care and kindness; and remaining optimistic, hopeful, and committed to change. The online MPH, now in its 12th year, has grown from eight students its first year to 260+ students today. The program has also grown from an interdisciplinary program to now provide students with 3



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choices for program concentration: health policy and management (approved 2017), epidemiology and biostatistics (approved 2020) and public health nutrition (approved 2021). Given the pace of this program with two admission cycles per year, two new cohorts enrolled, onboarded and starting each year, two annual campus visits for the first and second-year students, respectively, the program has grown to a level where additional student services and advising support is needed, primarily focused on supporting online students in their journey and experience with UC Berkeley's online MPH program(s) for the Epidemiology and Biostatistics concentration and Health Policy and Management.

### Responsibilities

#### Academic Advising:

- Report to the Director of Online Student Services & Advising and support Concentration faculty leads.
- Manage a portfolio of online MPH students.
- Advise students and faculty on program requirements, procedures, problems and administrative issues for degree/program completion.
- Identify students with progression problems and recommends interventions to the Director of Online Student Services & Advising.
- Provide support to students to map out academic curricula including making recommendations on courses and liaising with Graduate Certificate coordinator (if applicable) with help from the Academic Director and Faculty Advisors if necessary.
- Academic Progress: Monitor students' academic progress and counsel and assist with retention efforts and degree check-out.
- Act as the primary contact for the assigned concentrations, triaging and processing student requests for course withdrawals, course swaps and/or additional course enrollments.
- Coordinate with the SIS/Registrar's Office accordingly.
- Identify students who are not making good academic progress and report back to the Director of Online Student Services & Advising and Academic Director for interventions.
- Coordinate with students who withdrew from the program in order to make arrangements for their re-enrollment requests.
- Advise students on GPA requirements, academic probation, and guide students on how to come out of academic hardship where necessary.



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Enrollment:

- Ensure that program students are properly enrolled and registered and that their fees are paid and blocks are cleared.
- Manage waitlists, update rosters and inform faculty/instructors/program administration on new cohorts during the academic year.
- Advise students on enrollment policies & procedures, grading options (e.g., Incomplete), and process add/drops.
- Within the School of Public Health, make recommendations for the improvement of the student experience online.
- Work with faculty and the various Faculty Academic Advisor(s) to support our student population.

Concentration Leadership:

- Work closely with the Faculty Leads of the Epidemiology & Biostatistics and Health Policy and Management Concentrations and provide student services input about concentration requirements, graduate certificates and online courses in assigned areas.
- Help identify student concerns with existing courses or certificates and coordinate with the Faculty Lead, course Faculty and instructional design team in addressing them.
- Ensure that program policies, as written, are student-centered and align with real world cases.
- Make recommendations for policy language updates and student services process improvements to the Director of Online Student Services & Advising.

Records Management:

- Coordinate with the Office of the Registrar for resolving student grade issues and replace incomplete grades with letter grades.
- Maintain accurate records of each student's course completions, final grades.

Event Planning:

• Collaborate with other student services staff, Dean's Office and faculty to plan and implement complex, high-visibility student events, including new graduate student orientations; on campus summer visits, academic success strategies; and student life engagement/enrichment programs with a focus on equity, inclusion and belonging.



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Professional Development:

- Represent OOMPH in bi-weekly Student Services & Student Affairs Resource Group and monthly Graduate Division GSAO monthly meetings.
- Participate in workshops, training, conferences, meetings, and other professional development activities.
